USDA funds WIC through its Food and Nutrition Programs (FNS)





- In California, WIC is administered by the Department of Public Health
- 84 local WIC agencies receive funding to operate at a local level

Women

- Pregnant
- Breastfeeding (up to the infant's first birthday)
- Postpartum (up to <u>6 months</u> after birth or pregnancy end date, including pregnancy loss)



■ Up to **5th birthday**

· Up to the child's fifth birthday







Therapeutic Formulas

Formulas for Medical Conditions

Medically necessary therapeutic formula is a covered benefit under MediCal and MediCal Managed Care.

WIC requires the health care provider to submit an authorization/referral to the patient's MediCal Managed Care plan or a prescription for the patient to take to a pharmacy that accepts MediCal.

If Medi-Cal or Medi-Cal Managed Care denies coverage for a formula, WIC requests that the participant bring in a copy of the denial letter. WIC may be able to assist the family with one of the following formulas:







- Also, offered individually during counseling by phone






